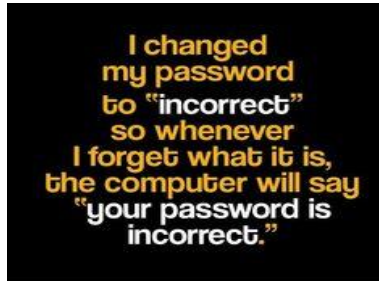
Check the calendar for some favorites and new events this month! Once again we will be going to the American Candle Factory and Mount Airy.
